INTRODUCTION

There now follows the complete archival listing prepared by Caroline Brown in 2001. This will give readers the opportunity to understand the overall organisation of the archive and to locate material which has not been included in the microfilm edition, such as audio-visual and restricted material.

The collection reference for RBMU archive is CSCNWW 33. To aid readers we have given the relevant reel number to the right of each entry. An item marked *NF* has not been filmed.

GENERAL AND HEADQUARTERS

RBMU UK Minutes

During the early years most decisions were made by the Guinness family but from the end of the 19th century business was conducted by a group of directors sometimes supported by advisory councils. From 1976 the board was known as the London or British Council. Responsibility for the daily running of the mission usually fell to a general or executive secretary.

Harley Institute/College Council Minutes

Minutes of the meetings of the Harley College Council formed as an advisory council in 1896 referring to: members of council; finances of Harley House and affiliated institutions such as Berger Hall and the Mackenzie Memorial Medical Mission; and students, staff and curriculum; with occasional mention of overseas missions. The Council met infrequently and not at all between March 1900 and June 1908. The volume also includes lists of addresses of directors with notes of deaths and resignations (1936-1946). Indexed.

RBMU Overseas Councils and RBMU International

At the start of the 20th century there were councils promoting the work of the RBMU in the US, Canada and Australia, but these were fairly informal and depended on the commitment of the individuals involved. In 1943 the Australian Nepalese Mission began working closely with the RBMU and in 1948 the ANM was formally taken over and an RBMU council established in Australia. The visit of Ebenezer Vine, General Secretary, to America and Canada in 1947 led to the establishment of formal councils, the first meetings being held in 1948. By 1971 half of the RBMU's missionaries were from the US and Canada. In 1972 the Councils became autonomous and, despite the formation of an International Council (1977), after a series of discussions about methods, areas and theological principles, the UK and overseas councils formally split (1979), the latter becoming RBMU International.

The RBMU worked closely with other bodies in various fields on several occasions and at times considered formal co-operation or merger. By the latter part of the 20th century there were frequent discussions about the role of the mission in relation to other agencies and on a practical level RBMU moved into new offices (Whitefield House) which it shared with the number of organisations. (See also files on Scotland above).

Inter-Mission Co-operation/Whitefield House, London

Correspondence, minutes, and reports relating to the co-operation or merger with other missions, includes: discussions with the Unevangelized Fields Mission (UFM), the Bible and Medical Missionary Fellowship (BMMF, later BMMF Interserve, later Interserve), EUSA (Evangelical Union of South America, with the Andes Evangelical Mission), INF (International Nepal Fellowship), and the International Christian Fellowship (ICF); material on sharing of offices at Whitefield House with the Evangelical Alliance (EA), BMMF, EUSA/AEM, and the Church Society (from 1980 held in trust by COST Christians in Overseas Service Trust, includes a plan of the building); and discussions about possible further co-operation such as an umbrella name, shared personnel or seconded missionaries; from 1980 the bulk of the material is on the management of the building.

Material relating to contact with the SMF or Schweizerische Missions-Gemeinschaft (SMG, founded 1951), in particular correspondence with and about Swiss missionaries accepted by RBMU for work in Congo referring to all aspects of work in the field including relations with the Zaire Mission (later the United Evangelical Mission) and with CADELU; joint projects such as those supported by TEAR fund or with the Missionary Aviation Fellowship (MAF); and RBMU withdrawal from Congo and the involvement of Action Partners; also includes occasional references to other fields and to missionaries for Peru (from 1984). General Publications

Originally news of the Institute was given in a *Monthly Messenger*, a specially adapted version of the *Pictorial News* (edited by Henry Grattan Guinness, from 1877 the *Illustrated Missionary News*) and occasionally in pages of the *News* itself. From Oct 1878 the mission's own magazine, *Regions Beyond* (later *Horizons*) was published. Australia and America at times produced their own versions of *Regions Beyond* and sometimes a separate magazine (*Venture*) was produced for children.

Regions Beyond/Horizons

Issues of the mission's magazine or journal usually published quarterly or bi-monthly. In 1884 it was published as *The Regions Beyond and Illustrated Missionary News*, from 1888 it absorbed F B Meyer's *Worship and Work*. During the two world wars it sometimes appeared as a *Newsletter*, for a time after the Second World War it included a special Australian section, and from 1981 it was called *Horizons*. Early volumes refer to news of Harley students and RBMU missionaries but also to the work of other missions, particularly in Africa including the Sudan, and in China; later volumes concentrate on RBMU work with lists of missionaries in each field; volumes sometimes contain accounts and annual reports; most issues contain high quality maps, engravings (early issues) and photographs and frequently sections for children; sometimes special issues were produced to commemorate deaths or anniversaries or concentrated on particular mission fields; volumes until the 1930s were usually indexed.
